



JACKSONVILLE: WEAVING WITH PRIDE

While perusing old "Shuttle, Spindle, & Dyepot" magazines an article entitled, "Maryland: Weaving with Pride " caught my attention. The article described several large group projects undertaken and completed by the Baltimore Weaver's Guild. The first was a group effort that produced 29 transparencies depicting familiar scenes from the inner harbor area of Baltimore, Maryland. The group spent 12 months completing the transparencies and then hosted the first of many exhibits to showcase their work.

Question: Could we as a guild weave transparencies depicting scenes from the Jacksonville harbor or other local landmarks? (What a great gallery show!!!)

The second project was a result of a request by the Maryland Governor's mansion to have handwoven placemats and napkins to be used for state occasions. The Baltimore Guild produced 24 placemats and napkins and then added 12 more of each for use in the Lt. Governor's house. The guild members worked in pairs sharing the warping and weaving and another group was responsible for the washing, ironing, and hemming all the placemats and napkins.

Question: Should our guild consider a similar project?
