# Working with Chenille - presented by Susan Wallace, Lynette Holmes, and Barbara Wroten

Chenille, a French word for caterpillar, describes the fuzzy nature of this yarn with a core. Rayon is a highly processed natural fiber, composed of regenerated cellulose. Fabrics of rayon chenille can be light weight scarves, soft blankets, or sturdy upholstery. Combined with other yarn types unique cloth is created.
