

Calling All Weavers Guild Members!





Gerald Kopp brought a 2 harness loom made from a letter tray and a miscellaneous part donated by Judi Leatherberry. It went home with Zak Wines!




Le Anne Brown brought a Guatamalan doll wreath. Notice that each doll is unique!






Robal O'Larte showed a shrug created from various small amounts of yarn from a pattern in Simple Woven Garments by Jane Patrick (2014).
