During the summer we turned those plans into reality as over a dozen different weavers completed the three panel hangings featuring ten different weaves. November and December's exhibit at ReddiArts Gallery demonstrates our mission supporting and promoting the crafts of handweaving, spinning, dyeing, basketry, and the textile arts in Northeast Florida. As an added benefit, ReddiArts is working with some of our weavers to sell their items. During this year when most arts festivals have been cancelled, this is a benefit for many. Because twenty items were sold in November, ReddiArts asked if we would extend our exhibit into December but in a different space. Gail Karson, Susan Wallace and a half dozen volunteers spent last Saturday morning refreshing and reimagining the exhibit (photos below).

Our December meeting, the 12th at 10:00 am, will be virtual. Member LeAnne Brown will demonstrate Name Drafting for weavers via Zoom. Watch for your Zoom invitation in your email along with the simple directions needed for you to participate via computer, tablet or smart phone. And be sure to have plenty of holiday cookies and tea on hand to toast as we Celebrate the Guild.





One Warp, Many Structures: Exploring the Possibilities of Extended Parallel Threading

8 Zoom sessions over 2 1/2 days

For advanced beginners and beyond: Must know how to warp a loom and read a draft. For 4 to 12-shaft looms

As Marian Stubenitsky has shown in <u>Weaving with Echo and I</u>ris, extended parallel threadings

offer endless possibilities for weaving a variety of structures and designs. You will begin this workshop with your loom dressed in a two-color warp threaded on opposites. (Drafts will be provided beforehand.) Working with a variety of tie-ups and treadlings, you will weave a series of designs in Echo, Jin (Turned Taquete) and Shadow Weave -- and, after cutting off and re-slaying your warp, Rep and Double Weave. The takeaway is a sampler of colorfulpatterns and a broader, deeper understanding of the potential for extended parallel threadings and how to design them.
