<u>Weavers of Orlando</u> is hosting a workshop in February with nationally-known tapestry artist **Tommye Scanlin**.

Tommye Scanlin, renowned tapestry artist from Dahlonega, GA, is bringing "Weaving the Days of Your Life" to Weavers of Orlando in February. Explore the many ways you can use tapestry weaving for a daily practice at the loom. Tommye Scanlin has woven what she calls "tapestry diaries" since 2008. She will share several of her weavings and talk about the thoughts behind them. She will discuss insights she and others continue to gain from the daily practice. This class is for all levels. It can be done using your tapestry loom, a homemade pipe loom (search "Archie Brennan loom") or a store-bought frame. The subject matter can be as simple as the solar eclipse or something more. The workshop will begin Saturday, Feb. 17 and finish Monday Feb. 19.


